TRAVEL COACHING GUIDELINES

- Coaching a travel soccer team is a big commitment not just for the players and their parents, but for the coach too. Coaching travel soccer involves a high standard of soccer competition and a high level of administration and team management.
- The role that a coach can have on a player's life is significant in youth development. The soccer field
 offers a place to develop both as an athlete and individual, and lessons learned on that field will be
 carried throughout life.
- The positive impact a coach can have on a child is undeniable. It's about developing a child into a healthy, self-confident adult through the wonderful medium of soccer. Like parents or teachers, coaches can be hugely influential in helping kids learn about themselves, build relationships with others, and overcome obstacles.

COACH RESPONSIBILITIES

- The team's coach is directly responsible for any issue related to his or her team.
- Coaches are responsible for directing all practices and coaching the team during fall and spring travel league games and pre and post-season tournament games.
- It is the responsibility of the coach to arrange for a substitute or assistant coach to step in at practices and games if he/she is not available.
- The coach must work to help each player develop to their maximum soccer potential at practices and games, balanced by the need to achieve success as a team during travel league games.
- All coaches must be involved in doing outreach to recruit new players (within league recruiting guidelines).
- The coach should provide formal constructive feedback to each player during practices and at the end of each season, in writing or verbally.

COACH EXPECTATIONS

- Prepare comprehensive and meaningful practice sessions based and ability and age level.
- Attend all coaches meeting.
- Be on time to practices and games and expect the same of your players.
- Bring equipment and complete first aid kit to each practice and game.
- When coaching (Games & Practices) please dress in appropriate coaching gear.
- Require that players wear appropriate shoes, shin guards to practices and a complete kit to each game.
- .Conduct a parent meeting before the beginning of the season to discuss player and parent expectations, including commitment, appropriate behavior and timeliness.
- Work with the trainers to develop a training curriculum that fits your team philosophy and strategy.

ADMINISTRATIVE RESPONSIBILITIES

- Collect and submit all appropriate credentials by the deadline.
- Make sure all registered players pay their fee completely one week before the first game of the season. Players with outstanding balances will not be allowed to play.
- Maintain and provide to the league a database of all of your players and parents for easy club communication.
- Complete all post game league and club reports, including score form and referee feedback.
- Complete a report within 24 hours of a game, practice, or other related incident.
- Maintain positive and up to date communication with parents regarding date and time changes, and any other club, league, or tournament modifications.
- All communication to the MCYSA must be done through a club official or the club representative.
